## Address Resolution Tables

- 1. Why are you losing internet access when you alter the ARP to have a static address? Why does deleting the static address, then re-pinging the gateway fix the issue?**

You lose internet access because then it isn't mapped when it is changed, and it has to be mapped again. It fixes it because the ARP cache is reset, which allows you to be connected to the internet again.

- 2. ARP was designed to work with IPv4. What is used for IPv6 instead?**

Neighbor Discovery Protocol (NDP) is used for IPv6.

- 3. Look up the following systems: Nessus, Nmap, and Retina. Use contextual clues to figure out which specific program the following question refers to. Based on your research, answer the following questions:**

- a. What do the three programs do?**

Nessus – vulnerability scanner program.

Nmap – discovers hosts and services on a computer network, and scans for vulnerabilities.

Retina – allows you to scan multiple platforms, and provides you with automatic fixes and the ability to create your own audits (thanks Google).
