How to Write a Narrative Story

Let's say that you have been assigned to write a **narrative story** that uses a symbol, or an object used to represent a greater idea.. A **narrative story** is less structured than a traditional essay. A **narrative story** can be a poem, a song, a play, or a short story. However, it must describe a sequence of events and contain a message, moral, or lesson. This gives you a lot of freedom in not only your topic, but also the format in which you choose to write.

Using a Concept Map

Before you begin to write a narrative story, you should organize the information you plan to include in it. One way to do this is to create a **concept map**. A **concept map** is a graphic organizer that can be used to plan your story. In a **concept map**, your main idea is placed in the center with bold, large letters. Then, all of the ideas you have that are based on that central topic go all around the center. If you are writing a narrative story using a symbol, you can put your symbol in the center and details related to that symbol around the center circle.
